SCHOOL ASSEMBLY

Intended for the all-round development of the children and the promotion of inherent leadership qualities in them, each one is given an opportunity to speak or sing in the morning assembly. Newspaper briefings are also given by them daily. Thus, school assemblies are resonant with speeches on a variety of subject.

STUDENT COUNCIL

A student council is a group of elected student representatives who work together to represent the interests of their peers and promote positive change within their school community. The council typically plans and organizes events, provides feedback to school administration, and advocates for student needs and concerns.

HOUSES AND CLUBS

The school provides full opportunity to every child for his or her physical, mental and moral development. For class V-XII, activities are organized house-wise in the school. Students are divided in to four houses - **Atlantis, Olympus, Wakanda and Asgard**. Each house is headed by House Captains selected from among the students and House Masters from the staff. Besides the house activities, there are different clubs (Creative club, Literary club, Quiz club, Nature club) functioning under the guidance of club heads and student council.

FEES

- The school collects fees in three quarters.
- The fees for the first quarter must be paid between May 1st and May 15th 2025.
- The fees for the second quarter must be paid between September 1st and September 15th 2025.
- The fees for the third quarter must be paid between January 1st and January 15th 2026.
- A fine of Rs. 100/- will be levied if paid within 15 days from the due date and thereafter a fine of Rs. 200/- will be charged.
- All dues and arrears (if any), must be cleared before the beginning of the annual examination.
- No deduction in fees will be allowed for any prolonged absence of the child. Fee once collected will not be refunded on any account.
- Fees should be paid for the rest of the year in the event of leaving the school during the academic year.
- Conveyance fees should be paid in three quarters along with the fees.

ACADEMIC YEAR

One-time year-end examination is complimented and supplemented with internal assessment. The assessment scheme will have an 80 marks component for Board examination (class IX & X) along with 20 marks component for internal assessment. Total mark will be 100 (80 -External, 20-Internal). Students have to secure 33 percent in total in each of these components. For Class IX: The assessment scheme will be similar to Class X board examination.

Notes:

- a) Minor variations in proportion of candidates to adjust ties will be made.
- b) In case of a tie, all the students getting the same score will get the same grade. If the number of students getting the same score point need to be divided into two segments, the smaller will go with the larger.
- c) Method of grading will be used in subjects where the number of candidates who have passed is more than 500.
- d) In respect of subjects where total number of candidates passing a subject is less than 500, the grading would be adopted on the pattern of grading and distribution in other similar subjects.

(i) Periodic Assessment (5 marks)

The main purpose of periodic assessment is to assess the learning progress of students. As earlier, these would be restricted to 3 in each subject in a year and the average of best 2 would be taken for final submission of marks. These tests tend to follow a pattern which is quite similar to the final end of course examination and have a generally increasing portion of content.

(ii) Multiple Assessment (5marks)

Multiple assessment strategies relevant to particular learning outcomes are advised over the period of curriculum transaction. It includes quizzes, oral tests, concept maps, visual expression, field work, group work, class discussions etc.

(iii) Portfolio (5marks)

Classwork and homework assignments, self-assessment, achievements of students in the subject, reflections,

narrations, journals, art integrated learning, presentations etc.

(iv) Subject Enrichment Activities (5marks)

These are subject specific application activities aimed at enrichment of the understanding and skill development. These activities are recorded internally by respective subject teachers.

For Languages: Activities conducted for subject enrichment in languages aim at equipping the learner with effective speaking and listening skills.

For Mathematics and Science: The listed laboratory activities, project works and practical works may be carried out as prescribed by the CBSE in the curriculum.

For Social Science: Projects related to art and culture, development of life skills, map work will be undertaken as prescribed by the CBSE in the curriculum.

2. Co- Scholastic Activities:

Co-curricular activities for the holistic development of the student are promoted. These activities will be graded on a 5-point grading scale (A to E) and will have no descriptive indicators. No upscaling of grades will be done.

3. Discipline (Attendance, Sincerity, Behaviour, Values):

Discipline significantly impacts career shaping and it helps build character. Sincerity, good behavior and values develop strength and foster unity and cooperation. Therefore, the element of discipline has been introduced. Class teacher will be responsible for grading the students.

The internal assessment comprising 20 marks (5+5+5+5) entails objectivity and a structured approach.

CBSE affiliated schools, for the purpose of uniformity in classes VI to IX may replicate the same assessment model as described above for Class-X for Academic Year 2025-2026.
